All children were offered enrichment opportunities following Covid restrictions and all children accessed sports enrichment at lunchtimes weekly. Most children participated in at least 1 after school enrichment activity. Personal, social and emotional development has been vast which in turn has impacted with positive behaviour and self-esteem. Progress is accelerating. Some children opted to participate in sporting opportunities, which involved listening; following rules and boundaries; maintaining self-discipline and co-operating as part of a team. This in turn impacted on behaviour in the classroom and around the school and greater self-control is clearly evident.
